

REPAVING BEGINS TODAY

Work at Park West Village
Also to Widen 2 Streets

A \$279,545 repaving project will be started this morning at Park West Village, a slum-clearance housing development bounded by West Ninety-seventh and 100th Streets, Central Park West and Amsterdam Avenue.

Manhattan Borough President Edward R. Dudley said yesterday that the repaving job would

include the widening of West Ninety-seventh and 100th Streets to eighty feet. They are now sixty feet wide. The residents of the area have frequently complained that the two streets have deteriorated and become inadequate to handle vehicular traffic properly.

Mr. Dudley announced that he would receive bids next Monday for similar repaving work at Seward Park Houses, a slum-clearance cooperative development at East Broadway and Essex Street.
